For more information on the woman featured in today's program, try one of these books from your library or bookstore. Both are available in paperback.

Howell, Georgina. Gertrude Bell: Queen of the Desert, Shaper of Nations (Farrar, Straus & Giroux, 2008). A well written, well researched thorough biography of the woman called the "female Lawrence of Arabia."

Wallach, Janet. **Desert Queen: The Extraordinary Life of Gertrude Bell: Adventurer, Adviser to Kings, Ally of Lawrence of Arabia** (Anchor, 2005). Relying heavily on letters and diaries of MS Bell, the author portrays a "hard traveler, hack for Empire, cosmopolite, iconoclast, anti-suffragist – a complex, absorbing character.
